## **BIBLE: LISTENING TO GOD**

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*How does God  
communicate with me?*

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### INTRODUCTION

Our salvation provided us the unbelievable privilege of experiencing the relationship with God He intended for us to have from the beginning.

The key to any relationship is communication. God communicates to us through His Word... the Bible.

God left His Word on the earth in written form to be the authoritative standard by which He reveals Himself.

Nothing on earth will ever compare to the written Word of God until the incarnate Word of God (the Lord Jesus Christ) returns to establish His kingdom on the earth.

The purpose of this lesson is to show you why the Bible can be trusted and show you how to experience its purposes and power in every aspect of your relationship with Him.

As we learned in [Lesson 3](#), God created man to have an intimate, personal, love, \_\_\_\_\_ with Him. Though our sin separated us from that relationship, when we called upon the name of the Lord Jesus Christ for our salvation, we were born into God's family with the unbelievable privilege of experiencing the relationship with God He intended for us to have from the beginning.

As in any relationship, the key is \_\_\_\_\_. Just as we express ourselves to those we love through the \_\_\_\_\_ that we speak, God expresses Himself to those He loves through the \_\_\_\_\_ that He speaks. Those words are found in the book we call the "\_\_\_\_\_"... the \_\_\_\_\_ of God.

# The Supernatural Unity & Construction Of The Bible

# Section A

- ❑ The word we use to refer to the Word of God in the English language, “Bible,” is actually a transliteration of the Greek words “Biblos” (Book) and “Biblia” (Books). We use the word “Bible” to refer to the sacred “Books” of Scripture.
- ❑ We could say that the “Books” of the Bible are equivalent to the chapters of any other book. As a given number of chapters comprise a book, the Bible is comprised of 66 “Books.”
- ❑ Unlike chapters, however, the “Books” of the Bible each stand alone as a complete, self-contained “Book,” and yet at the same time work together in harmony with the other “Books” to form one “Book” called the Bible.
- ❑ The 66 Books of the Bible are divided into two major sections:
  - The \_\_\_\_\_ Testament with \_\_\_\_\_ Books.
  - The \_\_\_\_\_ Testament with \_\_\_\_\_ Books.
- ❑ The Book of Genesis and the Book of Revelation (the first and last Books of the Bible) take all of the teaching of all of the rest of the Books of the Bible and dovetail it together in a supernatural unity that can only be explained as coming from God.
  - In **GENESIS** we read: “In the beginning God created the \_\_\_\_\_ and the \_\_\_\_\_.” (1:1)
  - In **REVELATION** we read: “I saw a \_\_\_\_\_ and a \_\_\_\_\_.” (21:1)
  - In **GENESIS** we find the \_\_\_\_\_ Adam with his wife Eve in the Garden of Eden, reigning over all the earth. (1:26-28)
  - In **REVELATION** we find the \_\_\_\_\_ Adam (I Corinthians 15:45), Christ, with His wife, the Church, in the City of God, reigning over the entire universe. (21:9-23)
  - In **GENESIS** we are told: “And the gathering of the waters called he \_\_\_\_\_.” (1:10)
  - In **REVELATION** we are told: “And there was no more \_\_\_\_\_.” (21:1)
  - In **GENESIS** God created the sun, the moon, and the day and the night. (1:5,16)
  - In **REVELATION** “there shall be \_\_\_\_\_ night there.” (22:5) “And the city had \_\_\_\_\_ need of the sun, neither the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof.” (21:23)
  - In **GENESIS** the Tree of Life is \_\_\_\_\_ to sinful man. (3:22)
  - In **REVELATION** the Tree of Life “yielded her fruit every month: and the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations.” (22:2)
  - In **GENESIS** man hears God say: “\_\_\_\_\_ is the ground for thy sake.” (3:17)
  - In **REVELATION** man will hear God say: “And there shall be no more \_\_\_\_\_.” (22:3)

The word “Bible” means “Book” or “Books”.

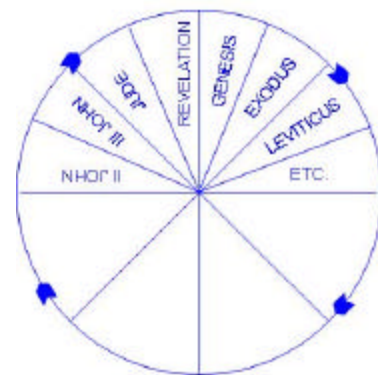
There are 66 “Books” of the Bible.

God combined the 66 “Books” to be one “Book” called the Bible.

There are 39 “Books” of the Old Testament.

There are 27 “Books” of the New Testament.

Viewing the 66 “Books” of the Bible in a circle rather than a list reveals the Bible’s supernatural unity from Genesis to Revelation.



- In **GENESIS** Satan appears to \_\_\_\_\_ man. (3:1)
- In **REVELATION** Satan “shall be \_\_\_\_\_ forever and ever.” (20:10)
- In **GENESIS** man’s \_\_\_\_\_ home was beside a river. (2:10)

## SO WHAT IS THE POINT?

*Though the Bible was written over a period of almost 1600 years, with over 40 different writers who came from all kinds of different backgrounds, who wrote from three different continents and in three different languages, and all kinds of different times, places, and moods, and wrote on hundreds of controversial subjects, from Genesis to Revelation, the Bible reads as if it were written by \_\_\_\_\_ . Of course, it was ... \_\_\_\_\_ !*

Yet, the Bible reads as if it were written by one author. Of course, it was... GOD!

## The Trustworthiness And Sufficiency Of The Bible

## Section B

### ☐ Read Psalm 19:7-11

*“The law of the LORD is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple. <sup>8</sup> The statutes of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes. <sup>9</sup> The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring forever: the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether <sup>10</sup> More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb. <sup>11</sup> Moreover by them is thy servant warned: and in keeping of them there is great reward.”*

In Psalm 19:7-11, God gives His own testimony concerning His Word.

In this concise but monumental paragraph God gives to us His own \_\_\_\_\_ concerning the Bible. He refers to His Word using six different titles, all of which contain the phrase “... of the Lord.” Obviously, God wants to be certain that we know that His Word proceeds from no other Source than He Himself.

In this passage, God uses six titles to refer to His Word...

Also note that each of the six titles for the Word of God identifies a characteristic of the \_\_\_\_\_ of Scripture along with a statement of its \_\_\_\_\_ to meet our every need.

Reveals six reasons it is trustworthy...

And makes six statements of its sufficiency.

**N**ow that we have seen God’s panoramic testimony concerning His Word from Psalm 19:7-11, let’s allow Him to give us a more in-depth view of each of the six monumental statements He makes in this passage concerning His incredible Book.

First, the Bible is “the law of the Lord”... It is the AUTHORITATIVE STANDARD by which God reveals His complete instruction.

**A. We can have complete confidence in any situation of life because we have God’s \_\_\_\_\_.**

- The title “the law of the LORD” refers to the fact that the Bible is the \_\_\_\_\_ by which God reveals His complete instruction concerning:

*II Timothy 3:16-17*

The Bible can be trusted because it is PERFECT... It is our complete and final authority.

**B. We can have complete confidence in the Bible’s trustworthiness because it is \_\_\_\_\_.**

- Unlike any other book on the face of the earth, the Bible is absolutely and completely perfect.

*Deuteronomy 32:4; James 1:17, 25*

- To get God’s mind on what He means by “perfect,” this same word is translated in other places in the Old Testament as “without \_\_\_\_\_,” “without \_\_\_\_\_,” “\_\_\_\_\_,” and “\_\_\_\_\_.”
- Satan has always sought to destroy man’s confidence in the **perfection** of God’s Word. The first recorded words of Satan in the Bible came to a human being in the form of a question concerning the validity (**perfection**) of the Word of God... i.e. “Yea, hath God said?” (Genesis 3:1)
- Satan attacks the **perfection** of God’s Word because he knows the significance of what will take place in a believer’s life when the Bible is not simply a \_\_\_\_\_ for living, and not just a key \_\_\_\_\_ of truth, but is the absolute final \_\_\_\_\_ for everything he believes, everything he is, and everything he does. (See this principle repeated in I Thessalonians 2:13.)
- There is nothing on the earth that is a greater threat to the kingdom of darkness than a common \_\_\_\_\_ with a common \_\_\_\_\_. Though most Bible scholars today do not believe that — \_\_\_\_\_ most certainly does!

*Mark 12:37b; Genesis 3:1*

C. We can have complete confidence in the Bible's sufficiency because it \_\_\_\_\_ the \_\_\_\_\_.

- ☐ A person living in the 21<sup>st</sup> century may find various means of accomplishing behavior modification (i.e. Psychiatric and/or psychological counseling, mind-altering drugs, hypnosis, self-discipline, etc.) There is, however, only one means in the entire world that has the power, not only to modify a person's behavior, but to actually "\_\_\_\_\_ " his "soul" (i.e. to change him from the \_\_\_\_\_ )! "The law of the Lord" **alone** has the power to stop a man in his tracks, turn him around, and send his life heading in the opposite direction because of a conversion in his soul.

*II Chronicles 34:18-28; Romans 7:7-9; Galatians 3:24; Hebrews 4:12*

The Bible is completely sufficient because it CONVERTS the SOUL... It changes a person from the inside out.

A. We can have complete confidence in any situation of life because we have God's \_\_\_\_\_.

- ☐ Just as a person is brought into a courtroom to give a declaration of truth concerning something he witnessed (i.e. a testimony), the Bible is God's \_\_\_\_\_ that witnesses to us of all that He is and all that He wants us to be. It is the "testimony of the LORD."

*I John 5:9*

Secondly, the Bible is "the testimony of the Lord"... It is God's TRUTHFUL DECLARATION that witnesses to us of all that He is and all that He wants us to be.

B. We can have complete confidence in the Bible's trustworthiness because it is \_\_\_\_\_.

- ☐ The word that is translated as "sure" in Psalm 19:7 is translated in other places in the Old Testament as "believe, trust, assurance, steadfast, established, and verified." In terms of the trustworthiness of the Bible we could say:

*The Bible can be "\_\_\_\_\_ " and "\_\_\_\_\_ " with absolute "\_\_\_\_\_ " and "\_\_\_\_\_ " that it is the "\_\_\_\_\_ " and "\_\_\_\_\_ " "sure" Word of God!*

- ☐ In II Peter 1:16-21 Peter lets us know that the \_\_\_\_\_ words of God are **more sure** than even the \_\_\_\_\_ voice of God! This is a very critical point in light of the so-called "Christian experiences" so many people have in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. **Every** "experience" must be placed under the scrutiny and judgment of God's holy, infallible standard which is greater than **any** "experience."

*See II Peter 1:16-21 compared with Matthew 17:1-9.*

The Bible can be trusted because it is SURE... It can be trusted with absolute steadfastness and assurance.

The Bible is completely sufficient because it makes WISE THE SIMPLE... It gives wisdom to those who lack understanding.

**C. We can have complete confidence in the Bible's sufficiency because it makes \_\_\_\_\_ the \_\_\_\_\_.**

- The Bible defines the "simple" as one who lacks \_\_\_\_\_.  
*Proverbs 7:7 – "And beheld among the simple ones, I discerned among the youths, a young man void of understanding,"*
- The Bible also defines the "simple" as one who is \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_.  
*Proverbs 14:15 – "The \_\_\_\_\_ believeth every word: but the \_\_\_\_\_ man looketh well to his going."*
- Unlike any and every other source of information on earth, the Word of God alone has the supernatural ability not only to teach facts and information but to impart divine wisdom into the mind and life of otherwise simple people.

***II Timothy 3:16-17***

**Key quote:**

*"You can be very sophisticated and well-educated, but if you don't know the Bible, God calls you "simple."*

**A. We can have complete confidence in any situation of life because we have God's \_\_\_\_\_.**

- The title "*the statutes of the LORD*" refers to the fact that the Bible is God's \_\_\_\_\_ that reveals to us His principles and guidelines for living. Because God is the creator of life, and because He alone knows how we must live to glorify Him, the Bible provides us with everything we need to live a godly life.

***II Peter 1:3***

**B. We can have complete confidence in the Bible's trustworthiness because it is \_\_\_\_\_.**

- Before we came to know the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior, most of us used a very \_\_\_\_\_ standard for determining what was right and wrong. Psalm 19:8a lets us know, however, that for those of us who are saved, determining what is right and wrong is now very \_\_\_\_\_. Very simply stated, what God says in His Word about a matter is right, and any and all opinions contrary to His are \_\_\_\_\_!

***Psalm 119:128; Romans 3:4***

Thirdly, the Bible is "the statutes of the Lord"... It is His ESTABLISHED DECREE that reveals to us His principles and guidelines for living.

The Bible can be trusted because it is RIGHT... It is God's perfect mind and will in all matters of morality.

- ☐ There are two very important reasons that you should never \_\_\_\_\_ that you know what is right without specifically \_\_\_\_\_ the Word of God:

1) What God says is right is contrary to the \_\_\_\_\_.

- Remember, we used to “walk according to the course of this world” (Ephesians 2:2). For the most part, that “course” taught us to think according to...

❖ \_\_\_\_\_  
(Something is deemed “right” based upon or compared to something else.)

❖ \_\_\_\_\_  
(Though something may actually be morally \_\_\_\_\_, it is “\_\_\_\_\_” in “this” situation.)

❖ \_\_\_\_\_  
(Though something may actually be morally \_\_\_\_\_, because its truth is offensive to some, it is “\_\_\_\_\_” to address it.)

- We must always be certain that our thinking about what is right has not been influenced by the world’s wisdom!

2) What God says is right is contrary to our \_\_\_\_\_.

- Let’s consider a few examples...

❖ God says that the way \_\_\_\_\_ is \_\_\_\_\_.

C. We can have complete confidence in the Bible’s sufficiency because it \_\_\_\_\_ the \_\_\_\_\_.

- ☐ The world is literally filled with people who are depressed, anxious, fearful, and/or hopeless. For many of them, life becomes nothing more than a frustrating and seemingly endless search for freedom, fulfillment, and happiness. God makes the claim that His Word is the end of the search – for it alone \_\_\_\_\_ the \_\_\_\_\_!

“Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.”

Fourthly, the Bible is "the commandment of the Lord"... It is the NON-OPTIONAL ORDERS God has given to man to provide direction concerning all things.

**A. We can have complete confidence in any situation of life because we have God's \_\_\_\_\_.**

- The title "the commandment of the LORD" refers to the fact that the Bible is the \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ God has given to man to provide \_\_\_\_\_ concerning all things. The Bible is not a Book of moral \_\_\_\_\_ or divine \_\_\_\_\_, but rather the complete, authoritative, binding \_\_\_\_\_ of the King of kings and Lord of lords.

*Deuteronomy 5:32; 12:32; II Peter 1:3*

**B. We can have complete confidence in the Bible's trustworthiness because it is \_\_\_\_\_.**

- The very words of the Bible are **pure** because they are \_\_\_\_\_ by God.

*Proverbs 30:5-6; II Timothy 3:16\*; II Peter 1:21*

*\*Note: The word "inspiration" comes from two words that literally mean, "God-breathed."*

- The very words of the Bible are **pure** because they are \_\_\_\_\_ by God.

*Psalms 12:6-7; 119:160; Proverbs 22:20-21; Isaiah 40:8; Matthew 5:17-18; 24:35*

**C. We can have complete confidence in the Bible's sufficiency because it \_\_\_\_\_ the \_\_\_\_\_.**

- God makes it abundantly clear throughout His Word that were it not for the power of the Word of God to "enlighten" our "eyes," we could never "see" (understand) the truth God wants us to see, or locate the path upon which he designed us to walk.

*Psalms 119:105; 130; Proverbs 6:23; I Corinthians 2:9-10, 13*

**Key quote:**

*"Scripture, because of its absolute clarity, brings understanding where there is ignorance, order where there is confusion, and light where there is spiritual and moral darkness. It stands in stark contrast to the muddled musings of unredeemed men, who themselves are blind and unable to discern truth and live righteously. **A. We can have complete confidence in any situation of life because we have God's \_\_\_\_\_.**

- “*The fear of the LORD*” seems like a strange synonym to use to refer to the Word of God. Many “Christians” today are repulsed by the thought of “fearing” God and seek to explain away the concept by using softer and gentler terms. The fact is, God uses the title “*the fear of the Lord*” in this passage to refer to His Word because the Bible is the very source of \_\_\_\_\_ that God uses to cause us to respond biblically to who He is. The biblical response to who God is is “fear”! Proverbs 9:10 says, “*The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.*”
- The wisdom of man will \_\_\_\_\_ you. It entices you to \_\_\_\_\_ man and \_\_\_\_\_ God (i.e. It gives man \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ qualities and gives God \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ qualities). It entices you to trust your own goodness and to exalt yourself (I Corinthians 2:1-5).

God’s wisdom, on the other hand, will not flatter you — it will “\_\_\_\_\_” you! It will enlighten you to the overwhelming awesomeness of the God of the Bible and strike “fear” into the depths of your soul. (See Luke 12:4-5 in the margin)

Comprehending the overwhelming awesomeness of God is one of the ways the Holy Spirit of God reproves us of our **sin**, God’s **righteousness**, and His inevitable **judgment** upon sinners. (See John 16:7-8 in the margin)

It was actually “*the fear of the LORD,*” (the overwhelming awesomeness of who God is) that caused us to respond biblically to Him by calling upon His name for salvation. It is now that same “*fear of the LORD*” that causes those of us who are saved to respond biblically to Him by surrendering ourselves to Him in reverential awe, wonder, and worship.

Fifthly, the Bible is “*the fear of the Lord*”... It is the source of CONVICTING WISDOM that God uses to cause us to respond biblically to who He is.

*“And I say unto you my friends, Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. <sup>5</sup>But I will forewarn you whom ye shall fear: Fear him, which after he hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear him.”*

Luke 12:4-5

*“Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you. <sup>8</sup> And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:”*

- Though the teaching of the Word of God has been in operation for nearly 2000 years, (and much of it nearly 4000 years!) its principles, precepts, guidelines, and instructions are just as relevant today as the day God breathed them into the holy record of Scripture. Should our Lord's return not be for another 2000 to 4000 years, they will continue to be as applicable, true, and binding because the wisdom that has been revealed through God's clean and perfect Word "endures for ever"! It has been and forever will be sufficient for every generation, culture, and age in history.

Sixthly, the Bible is "the judgments of the Lord"... It is the DECISIVE VERDICT from the bench(throne) of the Supreme Judge of the earth.

*"Today there is much talk among Christians about the need for unity. Wherever Christians gather you can hear someone saying, "If only all the believers could get together and agree, then the world would sit up and take notice! Then the devil would be running scared! Then there would be real revival!" The whole "Ecumenical Movement" is based on such a conclusion.*

*I must admit the thought sounds wonderful to have all those different denominations (and "non"-denominations) in love and fellowship with one another – that would be something, wouldn't it? Ah... but don't hold your breath... it can't happen. There'll always be a couple of real Christians around to spoil it!*

*"What?!" you say, "How could real Christians spoil it? Wouldn't they be the very ones who would be the most loving and ready to unite?" Oh yes! True believers are full of love— love for God, love for their brothers and sisters, love for souls – in fact, love would be the very thing that would make them oppose a mass move of unity.*

*"What?!" you say again. "Why that's the most absurd thing I've ever heard! How could love keep them from wanting to get together with everyone else who confesses to love God? You're not going to get me to believe that people with such deep love wouldn't just love to see all the churches and professing Christians come together in unity? Why, what could they love more than that??"*

*For one thing, they love the truth! Yep, they're pretty attached to it — those true believers can even seem right stubborn and ornery at times— the way they stick to the truth.*

*Some people have the craziest ideas— they want to try to do what only God can do. "Let's play Holy Spirit". That's what they seem to be saying. They think that if they can just get everyone to quit arguing about their different doctrinal beliefs, then unity is right around the corner. "Let's just all try and fellowship and talk about those things in the Bible that we all can agree on." There's only one problem with that kind of thinking—isn't the Bible all true? How can we just find the lowest common denominator to which all Christians can agree, and label the rest of God's Word "unessential for unity?"*

- Most major purchases (i.e. Car, appliance, etc.) are accompanied by an owner's manual. The owner's manual serves a dual purpose. Negatively, it provides \_\_\_\_\_ concerning the misuse or improper use of the product. Positively, it provides the manufacturer's guidelines and instructions so that a person may gain the full \_\_\_\_\_ from the proper use of the product.

Similarly, the Bible is God's "owner's manual" for our lives. Because God is the Creator of life and has specifically designed life to function according to His specifications, the Bible serves a dual purpose in our lives. Let’s take a brief journey through the Word of God to catch a glimpse of God’s heart in terms of His desire to have a relationship with humans.

Unlike the rest of God’s creation, human beings have the privilege of bringing glory to God out of an intimate, personal, love relationship with Him.

- As was stated in the introduction to this lesson, the key to every relationship is \_\_\_\_\_. Through our words we communicate our thoughts, our desires, our plans, our purposes, and our will. Actually, through our words we reveal who we really are! In Matthew 12:34, Jesus said, “... *for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh.*” The Bible is really the words God has spoken to man out of the abundance of His heart. Through His word(s), God intends to reveal Himself to us, and to communicate with us everything that is necessary for us to enjoy the intimate, personal, love relationship He designed us to share with Him.

God reveals Himself to us and communicates with us everything necessary to develop our relationship with Him through His Word.

- There are at least three key things in God’s heart that He desires from us in our relationship with Him.

God desires three things from our relationship with Him:

- God wants us to \_\_\_\_\_ Him.

To fulfill these desires, there are three key things we must understand:

**KEY #1**

We saw in John 4:23 that God is seeking “true” worship and worshippers. Obviously then, there is such a thing as “false” worship and worshippers. God makes clear that true worship has two distinguishing characteristics:

## Why Is The Bible So Supremely Important?

1. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** it would be impossible to possess the faith to receive God's grace for salvation.
2. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** there would be no power to bring about the new birth.
3. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** we would not be able to overcome the enemies that used to hold us captive in our sin.
4. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** we would be without communication from God.
5. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** we would be incapable of loving God.
6. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** we would be incapable of knowing God.
7. **WITHOUT THE BIBLE** we would be incapable of worshipping God.

### *Pulling it all together...*

In this lesson we have seen that the Bible is a supernatural Book because it is the revelation of our supernatural God.

As we approach the Bible intellectually, we find that God put the Bible together in such a fashion that there could be no doubt that He orchestrated its construction.

As we approach the Bible spiritually, we find that God so allows us to experience the effect of its working in our lives that there could be no doubt of its transforming power.

As we approach the Bible relationally, we find that God communicates with us, deepening our relationship with Him, leaving no doubt that it is, in fact, the revelation of Himself.

The Bible is, in deed, the single-most incredible and supernatural commodity on this entire planet!
